Huggins-Quarles Award

DEADLINE: DECEMBER 1, 2020

For graduate students of color to assist with research expenses for the completion of a PhD dissertation—the award is named for Benjamin Quarles and Nathan Huggins, two outstanding historians of the African American past.

DEADLINE: OCTOBER 1, 2020

For the best PhD dissertation in U.S. LGBTQ history—the award is named for John D'Emilio, pioneer in LGBTQ history.

DEADLINE: DECEMBER 1, 2020

For all graduate students writing doctoral dissertations for a PhD in American history—the grants are given in memory of John Higham, an important figure in immigration, ethnic, and intellectual history. Lerner-Scott Prize

DEADLINE: OCTOBER 1, 2020

For the best doctoral dissertation in U.S. women's history—the prize is named for Gerda Lerner and Anne Firor Scott, both pioneers in women's history.
