BIOGRAPHY: Richard Wolin is Distinguished Professor of History at the Graduate Center of the City University of New York, where he teaches History, Political Science, and Comparative Literature. He has also taught at Reed College, Rice University, and the Central European University. Wolin is an intellectual historian who has published widely on twentieth-century French and German political thought. His books have been translated into ten languages. They include Heidegger in Ruins: Between Philosophy and Ideology (Yale, 2023); The Seduction of Unreason: The Intellectual Romance with Fascism from Nietzsche to Postmodernism (Princeton, 2004); and Heidegger's Children: Hannah Arendt, Karl Lowith, Hans Jonas, and Herbert Marcuse (Princeton, 2001). Wolin frequently writes on political themes for the Nation, Dissent, and the New Republic.
